On your way home, look for things that have these five shapes.

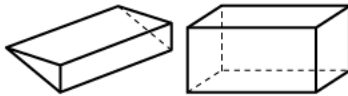

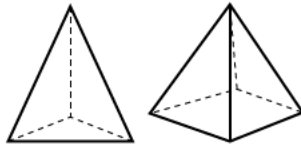

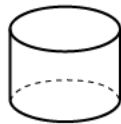
